Lenten Markets

Throughout the rest of the week, children will grow a deeper understanding of the Easter story through RE lessons and a range of practical activities such as art and crafts and dance. They will help the children learn about the events of Holy Week through fun and hands-on experiences.

On <u>Tuesday 1st April</u>, our Year 3-6 classes will be participating in the 9:15am Mass at St. Bernadette's Church which will focus on the Stations of the Cross.

The Stations of the Cross is a solemn and reflective journey that retraces the steps of Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion. It is a powerful and spiritual experience that provides our children with an opportunity for deep reflection and understanding of the significance of Easter.

Parents and family members are invited to join us and are welcome to walk to church from school on this morning.




